### INTRO

### This month's nonprofit feature: Project Pop Drop

Project Pop Drop is funded by a percentage of proceeds from toner and ink cartridges sold through Platinum International. John Snyder in Los Angeles, California, a longtime friend of Sharon Edwards, owns both the company and foundation. When Sharon got into the "toner business", she went out to California for training and went to her first Pop Drop, which was held at Skid Row in Los Angeles. Pop stands for "Partner of Provision". Upon her return to Oldsmar, she wanted to bring Pop Drop here locally as well.

Her first Drop was going to a Homeless Shelter in Tampa with a trunk full of food, purchased from Platinum International. At the time, Sharon's 90-year old father accompanied her on the drops and he mentioned other items that he noticed were needed. Clothing, toiletries and personal items. They shared all these needs with family and friends, and soon their home was overloaded with donated items. So much so that they had to rent a storage unit. These same family and friends became volunteers helping with the deliveries.

Originally, Sharon would go to Costco to purchase food the night before, and go to the storage unit and load up with the help of her volunteers. Jerry Peruzzi, David Frank and Doug Bevis guided Sharon to meet Josh Powell, the new Manager of Oldsmar Super Walmart. Since then he has been providing a grant to the different Pop Drop designated shelters monthly. Thus, another Partner of Provision formed and now Walmart hosts a Tailgate party once a year for the Oldsmar Cares Annual Pop Drop event in June.

When Sharon was the guest speaker at one of the Chamber of Commerce Relationship Builders, afterwards she met Yanya Reynolds who went on to become one of Sharon's Angels. She not only made a delivery with Sharon that month, she offered storage space and one of their box trucks for the deliveries. This effort continues today. Yanya and her husband own a local business called Beamworks. Their trucks and storage facilities save Sharon the storage fees she had for storing all the donations and they are always involved lending a big helping hand.



Each year Partners of Provision has grown, and they now have 32 Pop Drop collection boxes in businesses around the Chamber of Commerce's footprint. Sharon has the pleasure of heading her band of Pop Drop Angels, doing God's work and making such a difference in our community.
